WHAT IS A MSDS/SDS

A Safety Data Sheet (SDS) formally known as Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) is a document that gives detailed information about the nature of a chemical, such as physical and chemical properties, health, safety, fire, and environmental hazards of a chemical product.

WHO SHOULD Provide MSDS/ SDS AND WHEN

Who? OSHA requires manufacturers or distributors of chemicals to issue MSDSs/SDSs with the first shipment of any hazardous chemical product, <u>and</u> the employer is responsible for having them available

When? Employees use a chemical in the duties of their job, or when the product is used in a manner for which it was not originally designed.

If you use a chemical at work you *must* have a MSDS/SDS on file and readily available .
