Dress Code



Military Military members are authorized to wear the uniform of the day and / or appropriate civilian attire in the Haley Hall galley.

Civilian Patrons may wear civilian attire in the CGDF with the following prohibited exceptions:

- A. Dirty, torn or otherwise mutilated clothing of any kind.
- B. Combinations of military and civilian clothing (excluding the blue CG t-shirt)
- C. Headgear of any type (excluding food service personnel on duty, law enforcement personnel under arms, religious headgear, and headgear deemed necessary for medical purposes)
- D. Open-toed shoes of any type
- E. Halter tops, Sport Bras, Tank Tops, or any upper-body garment that exposes the midriff.
- F. Pants or shorts without s hem.
- G. Any attire that is sweaty, dirty, or otherwise soiled. (including gym attire as well as work attire).
- G. Revealing shorts, pants or skirts exposing undergarments
- H. Plain white undershirts or sleepwear of any kind.
- H. Clothing with language or logos showing or discussing illegal drugs, containing anti-military messages, or containing obscene or lascivious messages
- I. Other clothing deemed inappropriate by watch captain on duty in the galley

Other Attire The Commanding Officer or Executive Officer may authorize other attire under special circumstances. Only Coast Guard flight crews can wear flight suits and/or aviation gear in the CGDF.

Backpacks All backpacks, briefcases, and bags shall be stowed in the hat/coat storage area near the CGDF entrance and not carried into the dining room. Purses are authorized to keep on your person.
