## Commander ROBERTO TREVINO Executive Officer Training Center Yorktown

Commander Treviño assumed the duties of Executive Officer, Coast Guard Training Center Yorktown in June 2023 after serving as the Boat Forces and Cutter Operations Training Branch Chief since 2022. He assists the Commanding Officer in the general administration and direction of unit activities for the largest Coast Guard Training Center to deliver modernized, ondemand learning through seven "A" schools and 120 "C" schools and graduate more than 6,000 Coast Guard, federal, state, and local agency personnel, and international partners a year.

Prior to reporting, he served as Response Department Head, Sector New Orleans from 2019-2022. In this capacity, he directed operational execution of SAR, PWCS, MLE, and MER missions and led the integrated operational planning and execution of DHS
